The Hemet Police Department Volunteer Program was created in 1993 as a way for citizens to supplement the Hemet Police Department's sworn officers. The intention of the program is for volunteers to perform certain tasks that otherwise would be performed by sworn police officers and thereby allowing the police officer to spend more time on the streets. The Hemet Police Department Volunteers now operate a wide variety of services for the police department such as:

- Alzheimer Registration
- Crime Scene Call Outs
- Live Scan Fingerprinting
- Parking Enforcement
- Traffic Control
- Vacation Property Checks

Rosalie Moyer is also in charge of the Neighborhood Watch Program in Hemet. This program creates a neighborhood organized to be the eyes and ears of the police. Reporting suspicious activities and persons to the police as soon as they are observed is very important. Neighborhood Watch is a great way citizens can work together to prevent crime.

Neighborhood Watch operates to educate participants in the principals of deterrence, delay, and detection. It depends on the communication network organized at three levels:

1. Residents
2. Block Captains
3. Police

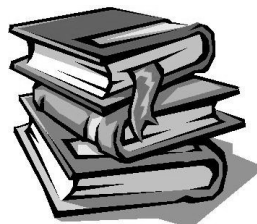
